
The Lions boasted a very explosive offense with well-balanced attacks of passing and rushing respected by all its foes. Senior quarterback and Captain, Tim Hulett, led the offense. Along with his leadership, Hulett supplied the offense with 544 yards rushing and completed passes for 959 yards.

A strong and agressive defense sometimes took the leading role in Lanphier's victories. In fact, 50% of the Lion wins found the opponents scoreless. Lanphier produced shutouts against Lincoln, Springfield, and Southeast with scores of 21-0. 14-0. and 20-0 respectively.

Several members of the squad were honored for their play. Senior Captain Tim Barbian was named to the 33 member All State team at Linebacker. 
WRESTLING

With many wrestlers returning, the future of Lions wrestling appears bright.






