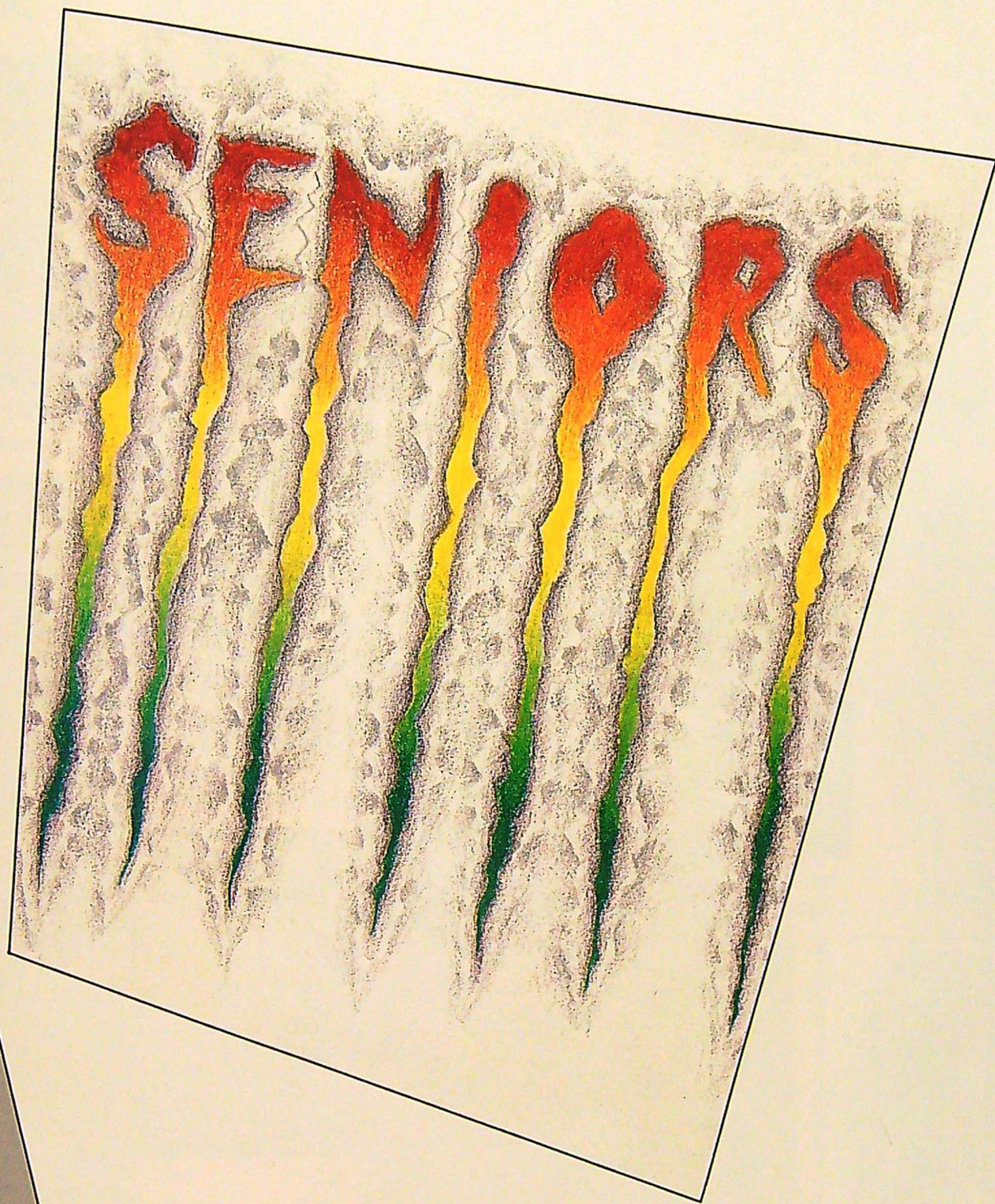

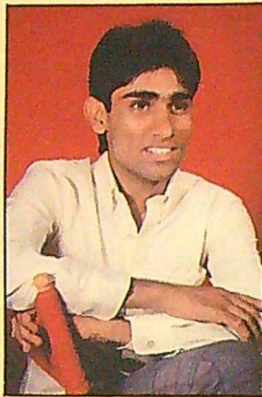


A Step Away

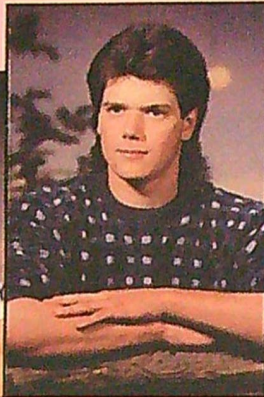
Vandals Will Never Destroy Lion Pride!

After the vandalism — our "dead" lions.



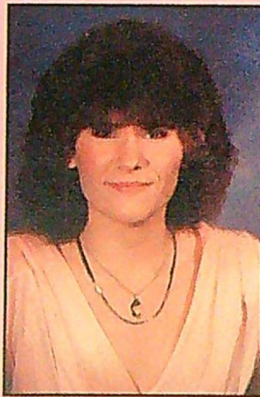
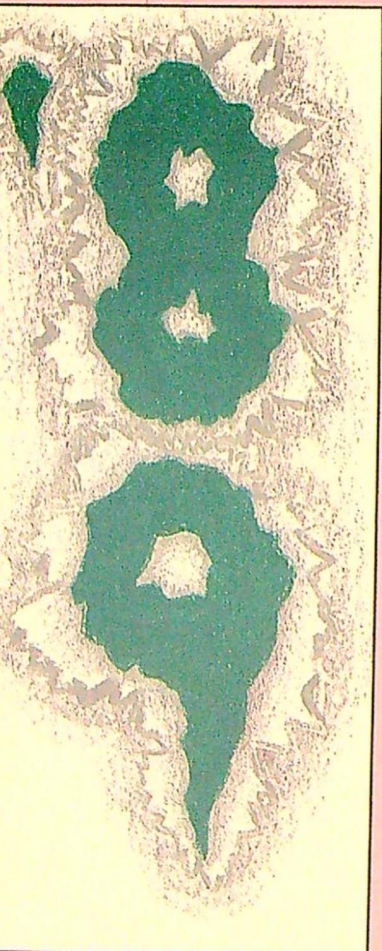

Jamie Malcom, Steve Ferrier, Scott Parker, and Chuck Helfer do not find anything wrong with the class of '89.

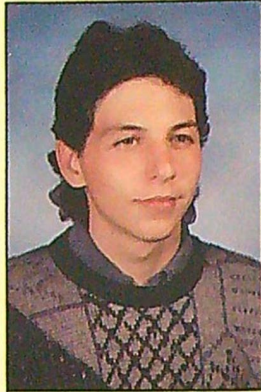




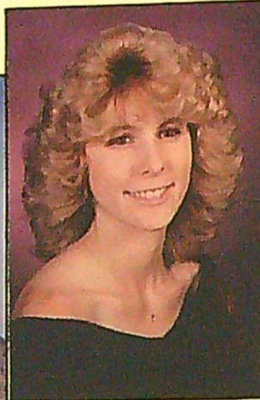

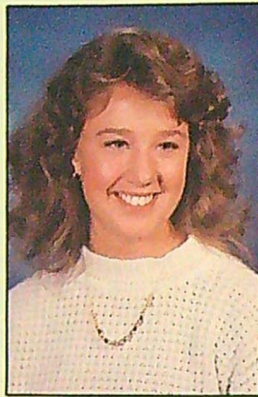




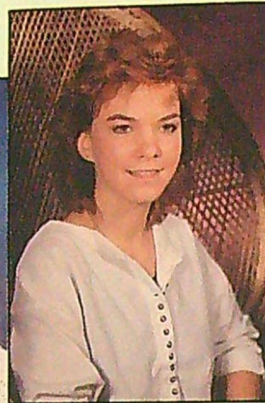
How Embarrassing!

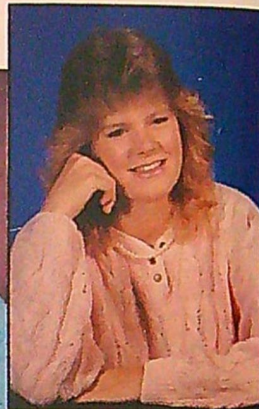
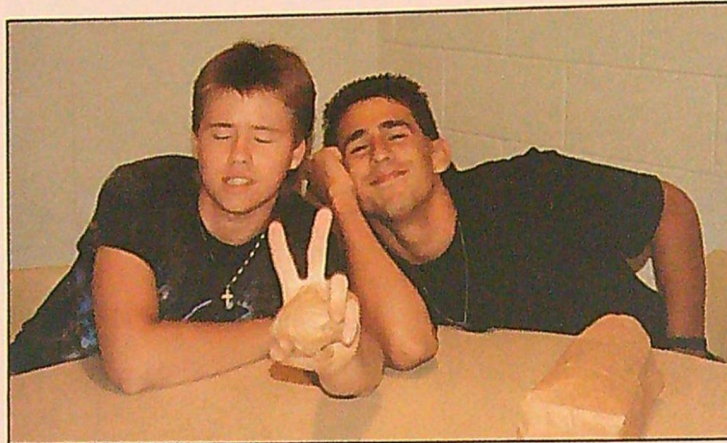


Food for Thought

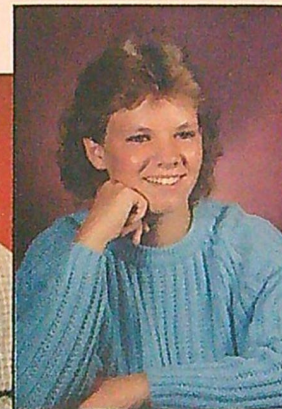

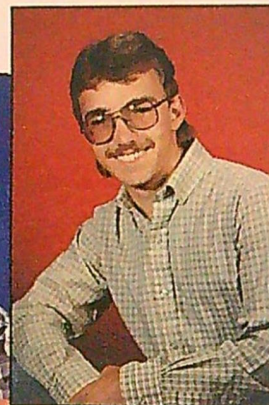
